


DEDICATION

TO THE STUDENTS



I want to thank all of our students who have made our school a place in which we can take pride. Your cooperation and attitude through the year is a great source of pride for me.




Ikast, Denmark (pop. 13,000)


Oslo, Norway (capital - pop. 450,000)

Beyond each new hill a new one waits and pulls us like the hidden hands of love.


Some of us thought we'd walk a little taller if we walked away.


Some of us were driven off some of us went driving off and there were those who couldn't do or wouldn't do what those who stayed behind were left to do.
