


MATH CLUB




SCIENCE CLUB


We are an enthusiastic class with a lot of Tide Pride. We enjoyed a successful Homecoming, with help from the freshmen class sponsors.

Band members, parents and friends worked hard all year to raise the \$26,000. needed for the June '87 trip to Florida. 100








