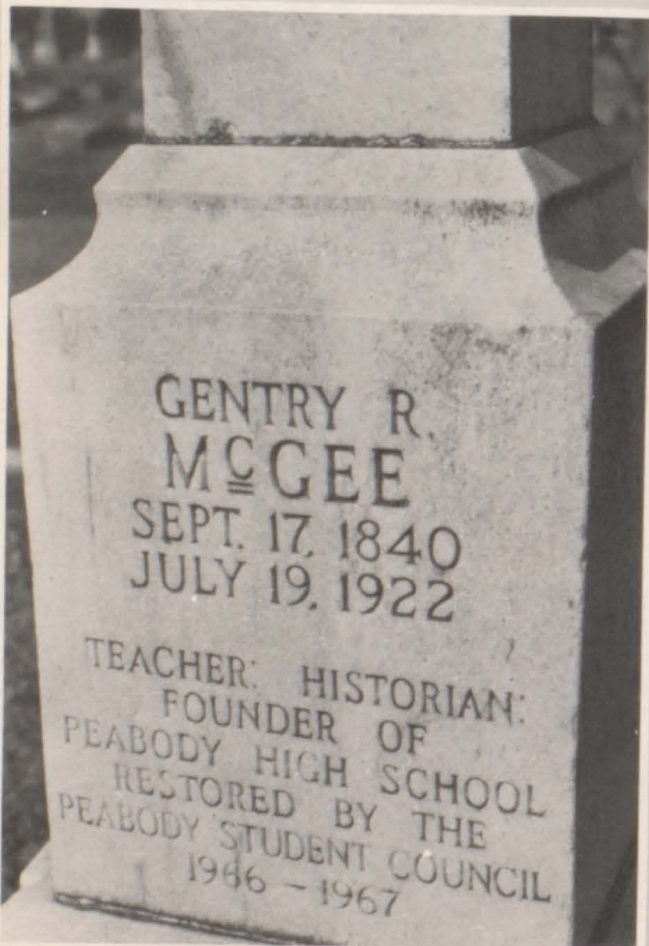
# PEABODY HIGH SCHOOL

Before the 1870's the ideal of public education was not popular in the State of Tennessee. Private schools kept the torch of learning burning. This was all right for those who could afford it, but for those who couldn't it meant they did without an education.

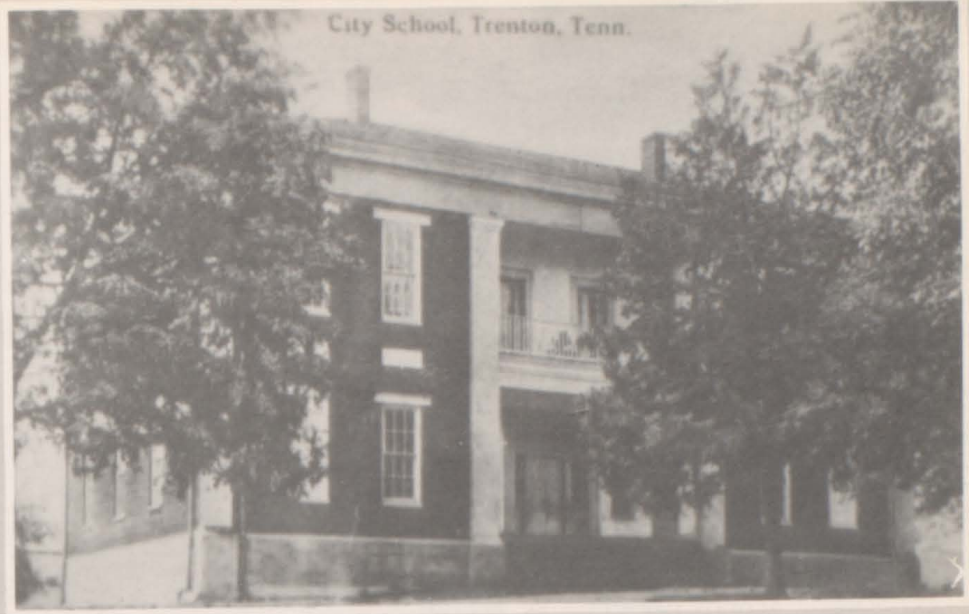
Several private schools were established with varying degrees of success. The largest and most successful of the private schools was Andrew College, located on the site of Peabody. The school was named to honor Bishop J.O. Andrew, whose ownership of slaves caused a rupture in the church before the Civil War. After the closing of Andrew College, the public school directors purchased the Andrew College property for use of the new Peabody School.

Professor McGee became a giant among Tennessee educators. His name became a household word in the state after the publication of his "A School History in Tennessee". It was first published in 1899 after he moved to Jackson; however most of it, if not all, was written while he lived in Trenton.

In 1967 the Student Council of Peabody honored Professor McGee when the group raised funds to repair the monument over his grave in Oakland Cemetery.

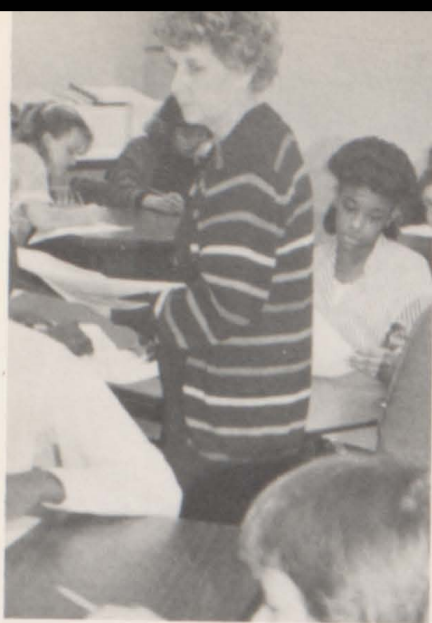

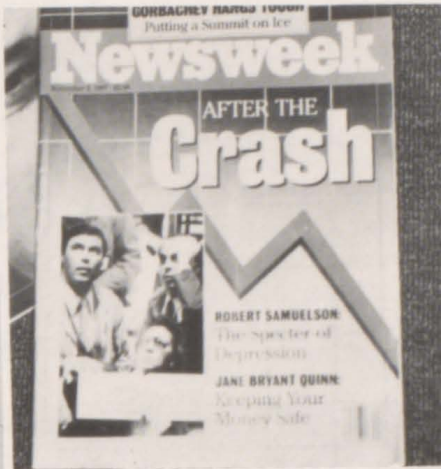
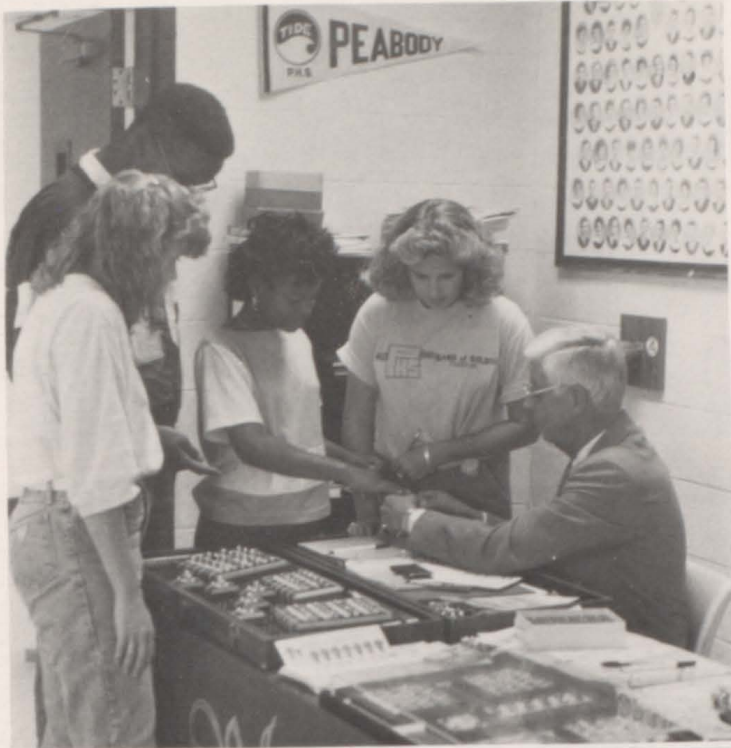
Mrs. Cash is married to Mr. Billy Cash and has two daughters, Pam and Julie. She lives in Bradford.

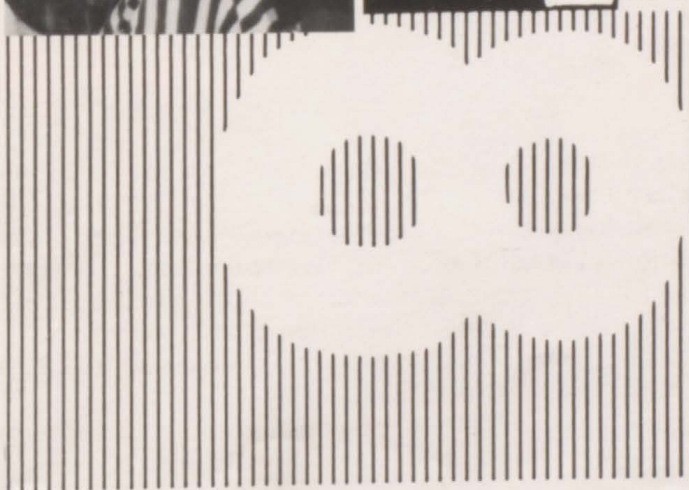

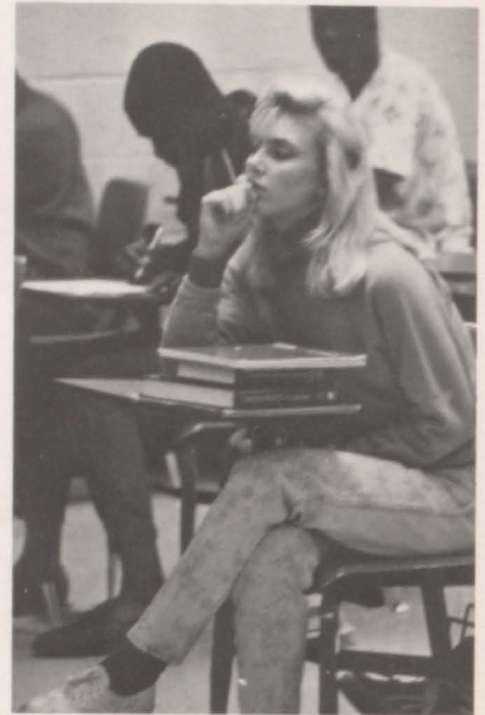

\*On Black Monday, Oct. 19, 1987, an over-inflated stock market saw the largest single-day loss in history.

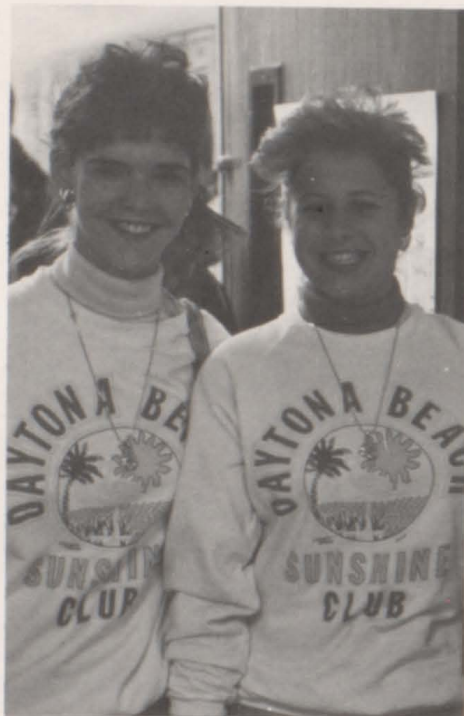
\*EVERYONE was wearing Spuds MacKenzie shirts.

\*Gary Hart dropped out and got back in the '88 Democratic Presidential race because of moral improprieties.

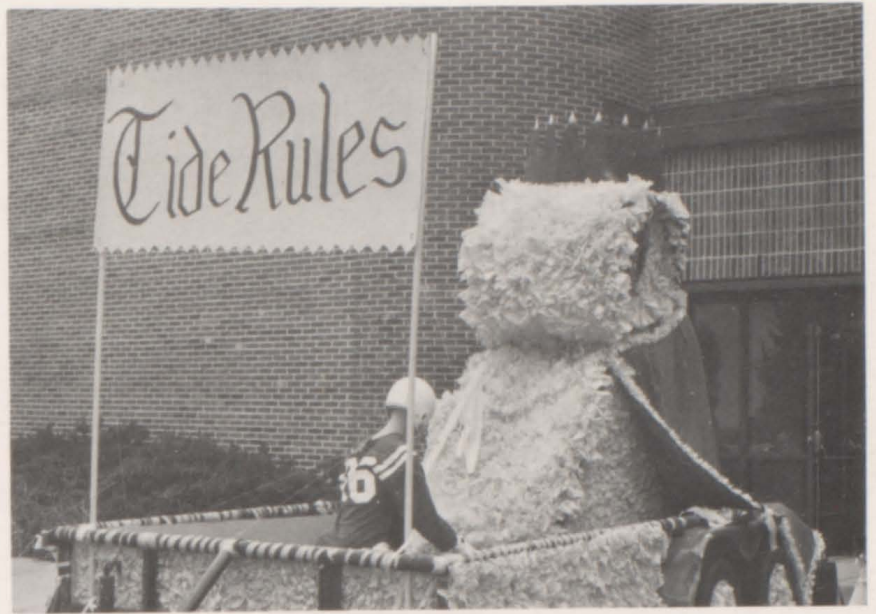
\*After 6 years, the marriage of Prince Charles and Princess Di was showing signs of strain.

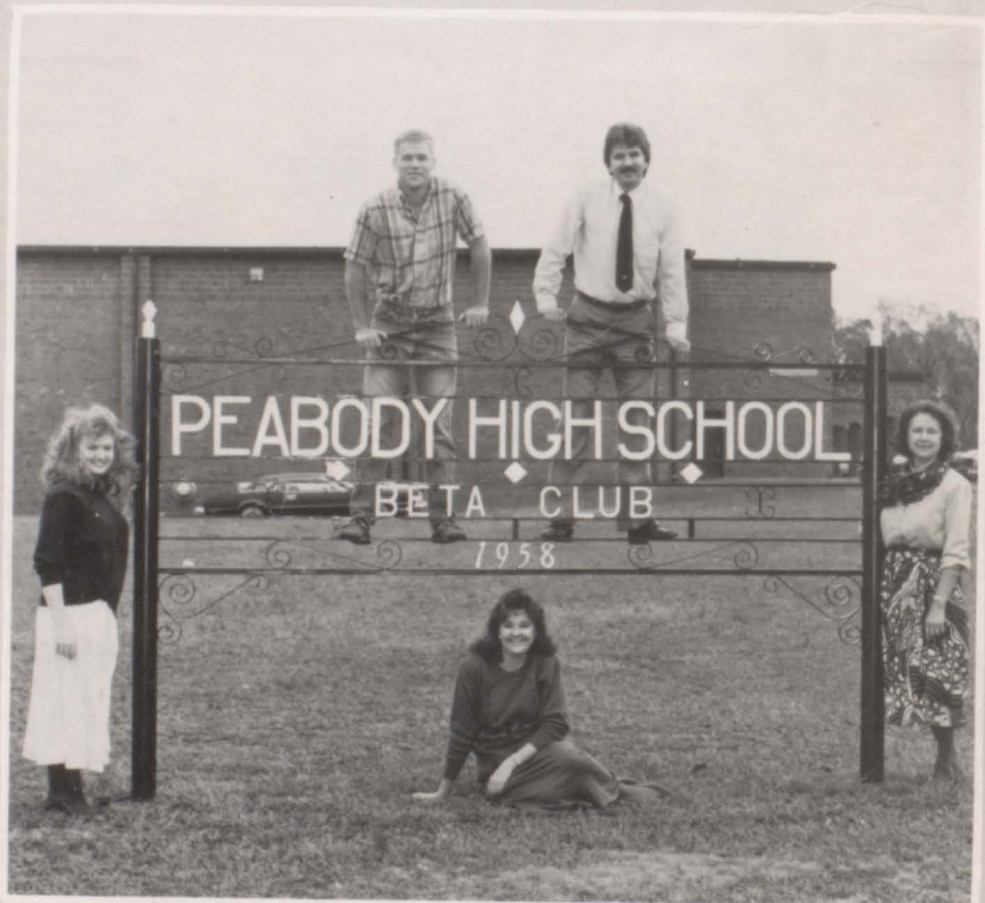
# BETA CLUB

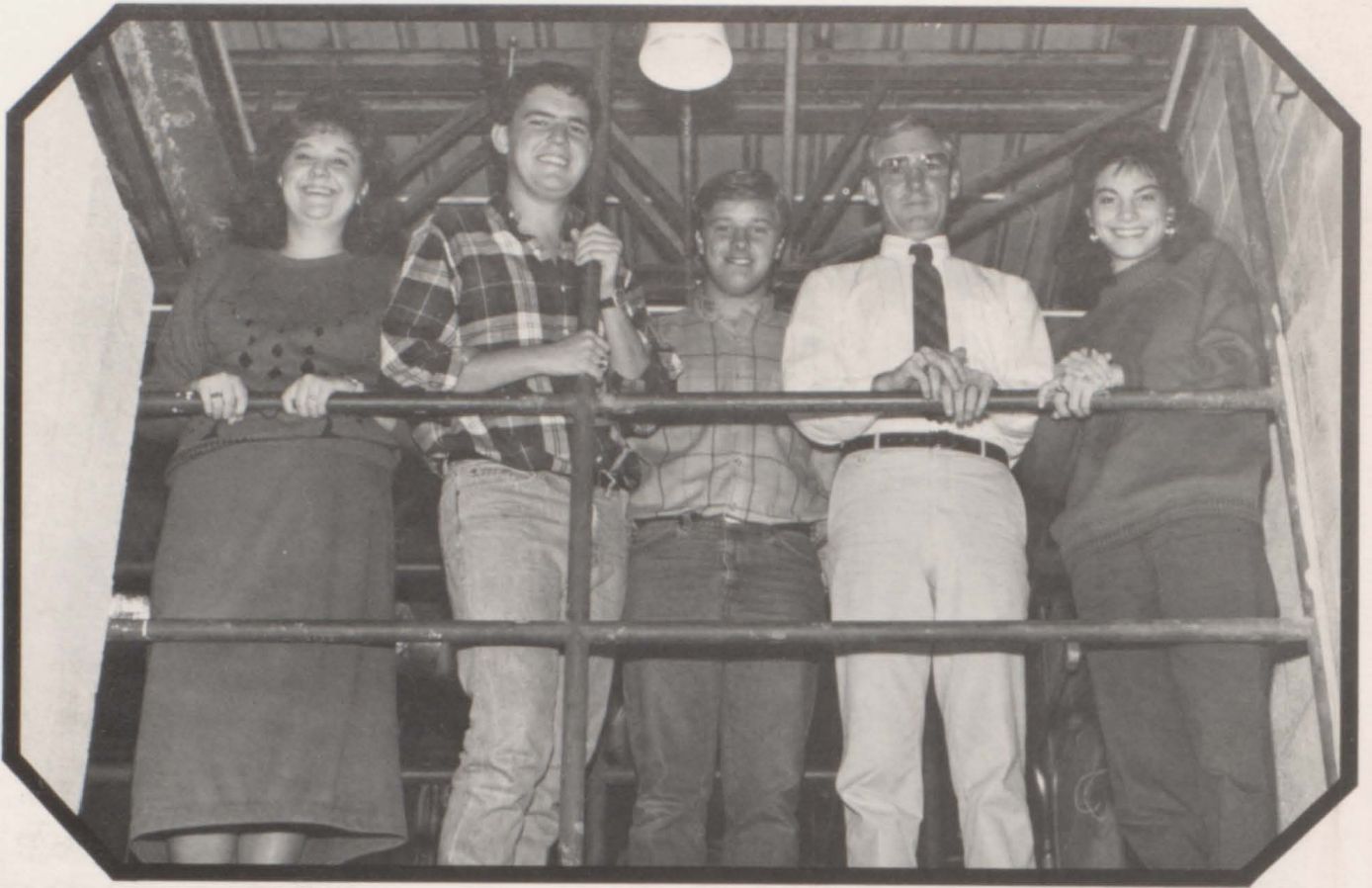

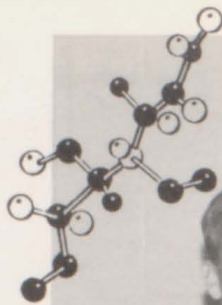

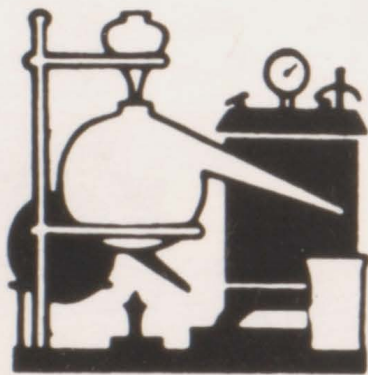
The academic decathlon is a national contest of academic strength. Students who participate study subjects which are more in-depth than those normally offered in high school.

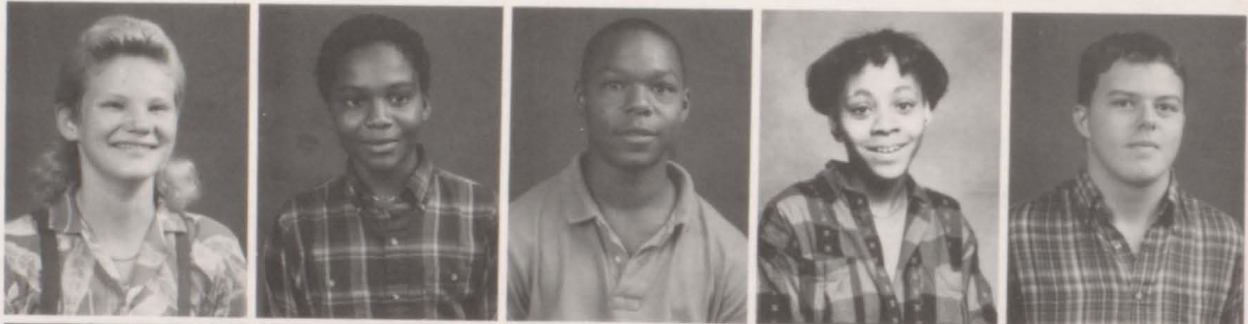
# FRESHMEN CLASS

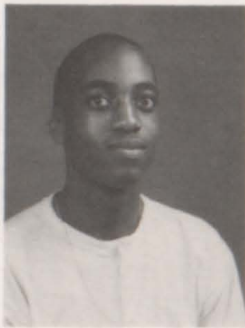
# SOPHOMORE CLASS

# JUNIOR CLASS

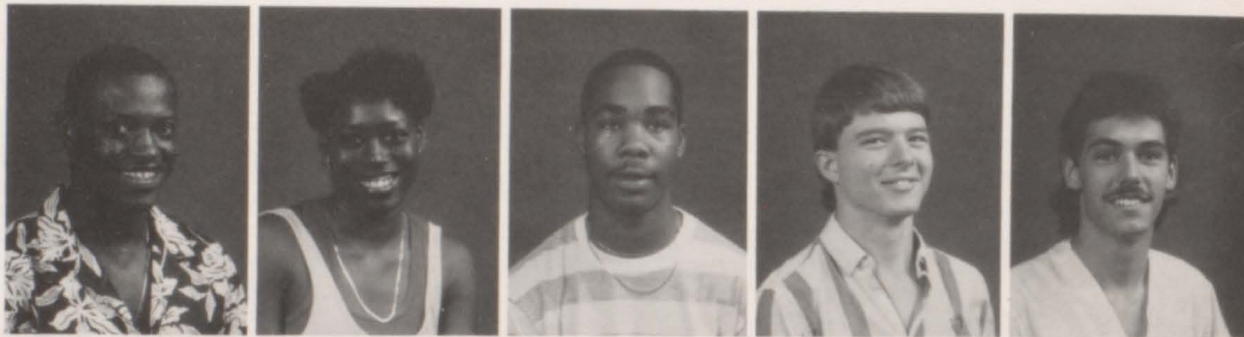

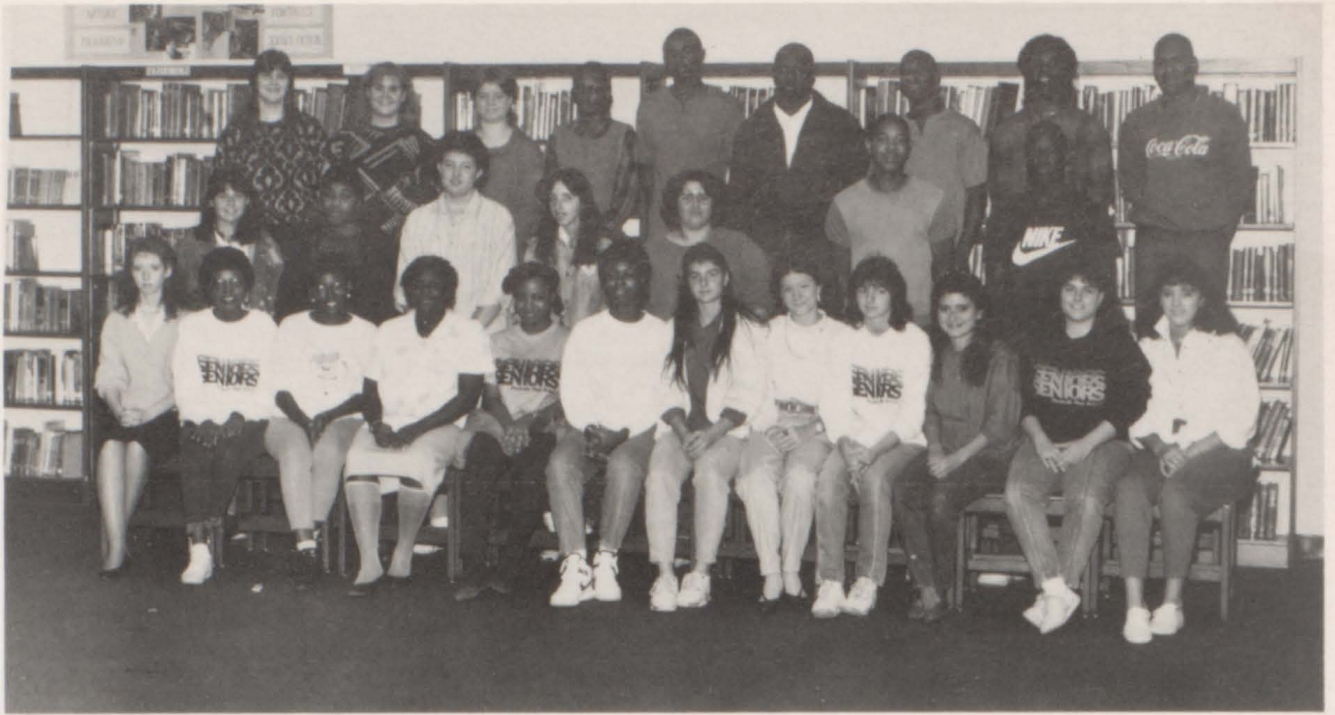
Peabody Special Olympics Club allows athletes to compete in events according to their ability. State and International events enable students to meet people from other places and cultures.
