The Golden Torch Staff takes pride in dedicating this yearbook to Mrs. Martha Crim, who is devoted to serving our school.


















Administration And Staff




BETA CLUB


















Don't forget HOMECOMING '88


Sept. 17 The Band of Gold went to Milan for the first contest of the year. The band took second place and Tracy placed second as field commander.
