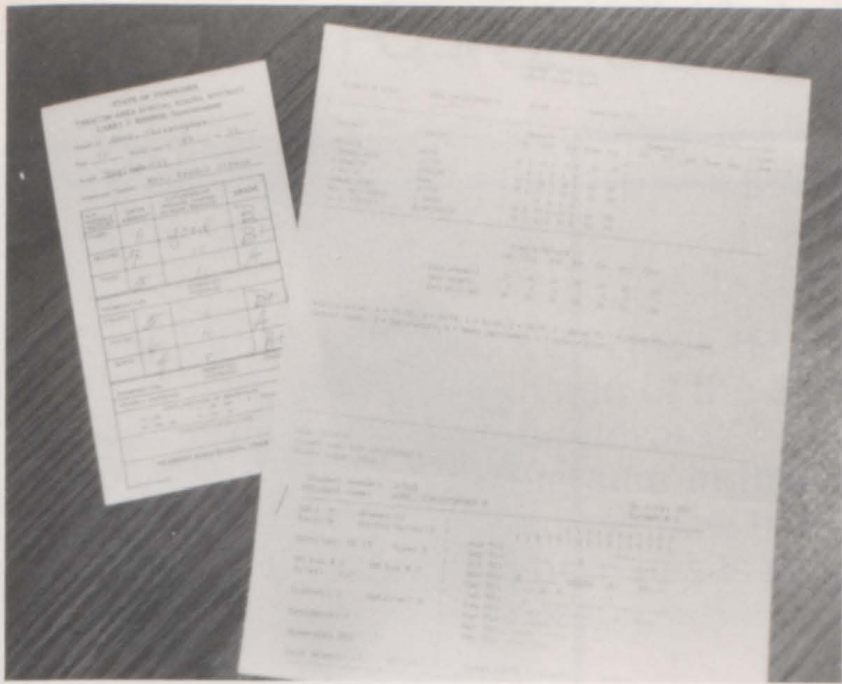


Channel I was new. Most students enjoyed missing the first 10 minutes of 1st period.



Long Distance Learning was praised by the community, but, most importantly, by students pictured below, Filona Thomas, Mandy Blackwell and Nathan Wright.





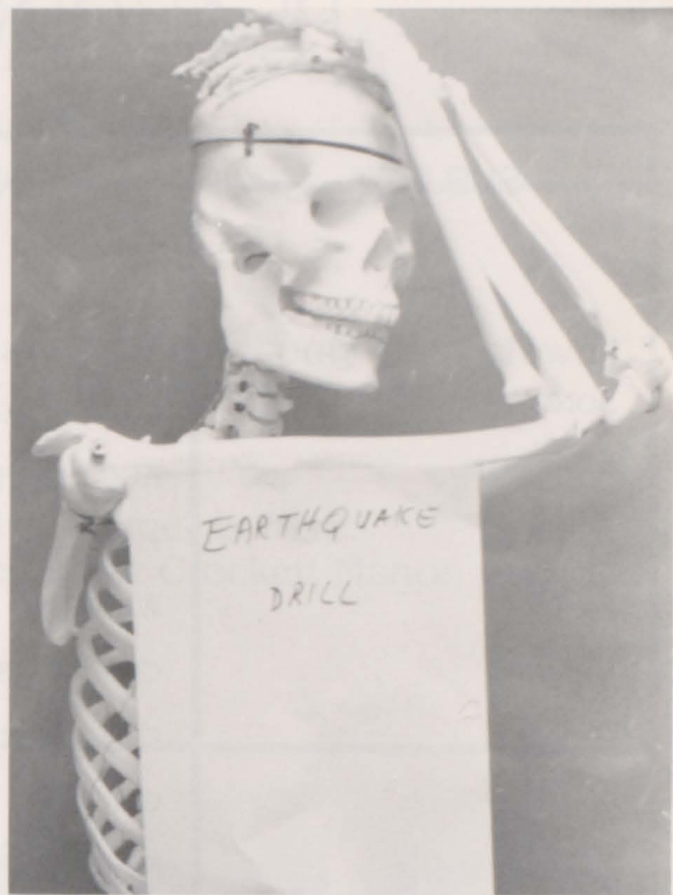

Class representatives and their escorts were introduced before the game. Suspense was high as the Homecoming Queen was announced — Angie Harris, senior class representative.

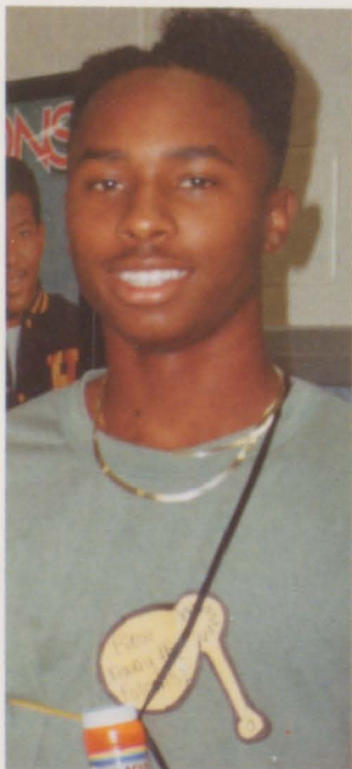

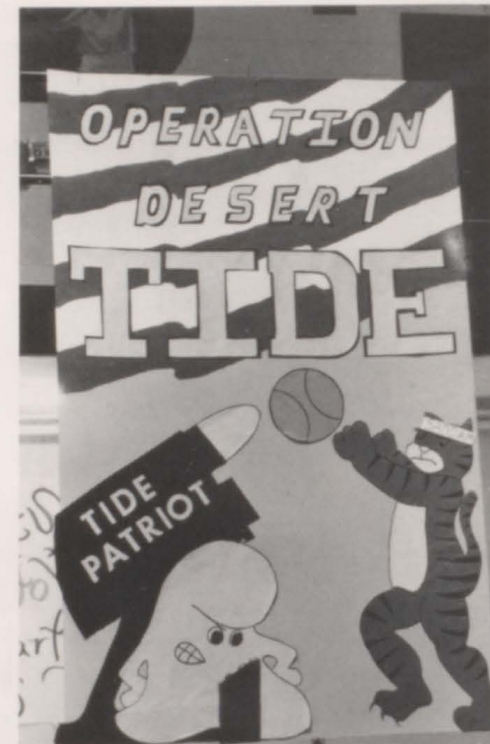
Spirit Week was Jan. 28-Feb. 1, with Friday's competitive pep rally being the highlight. Each day had a different theme:

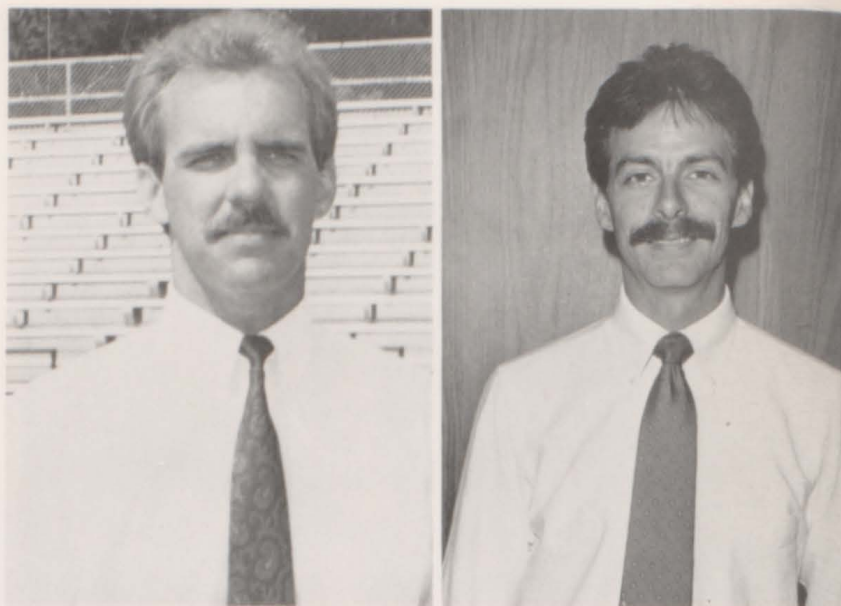
P.H.S. BAND IS PURE GOLD

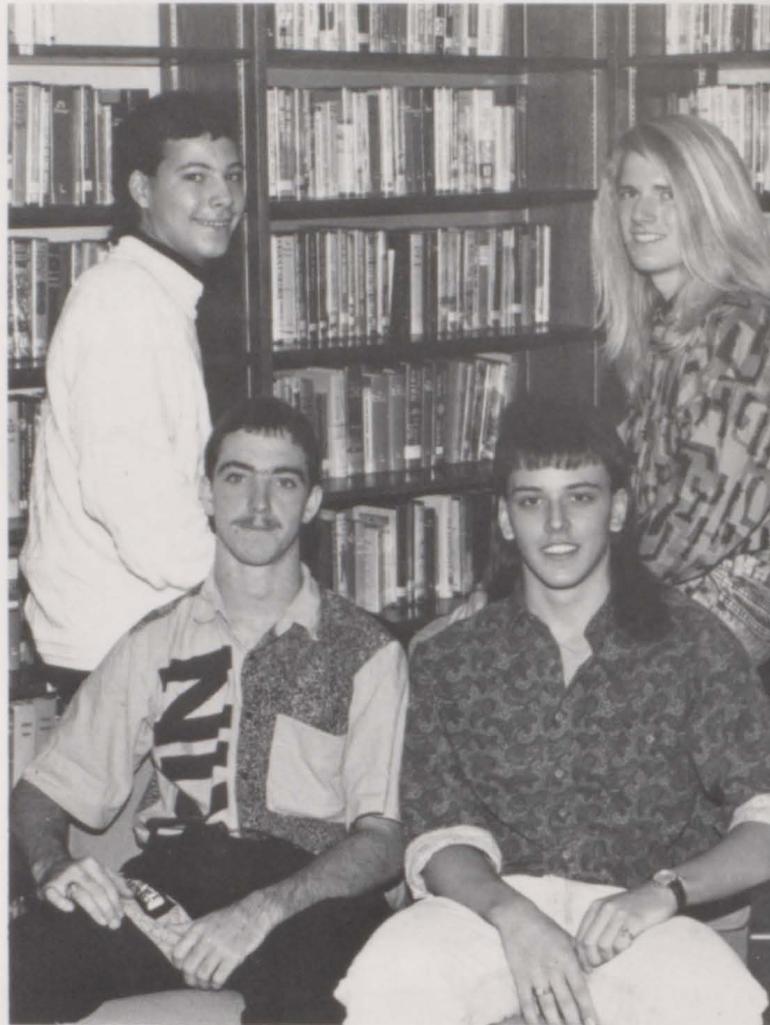

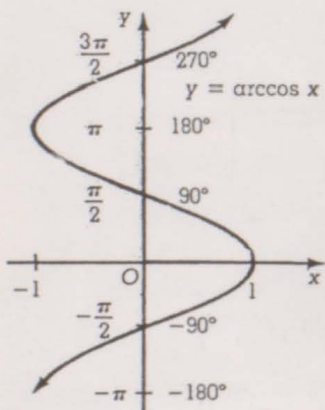

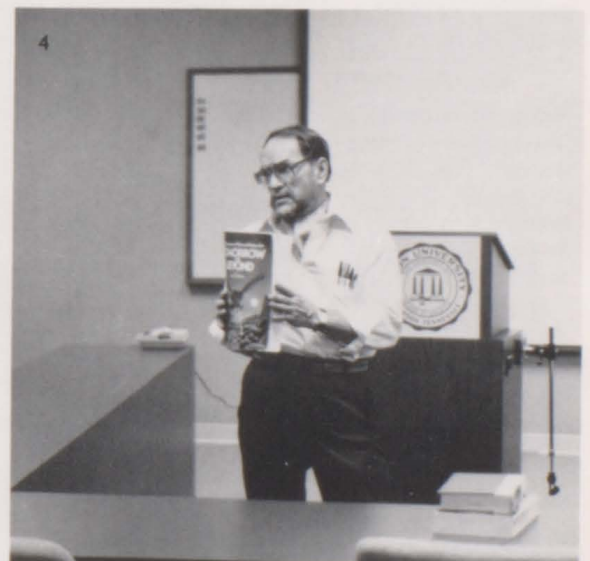

The chapter also participated in the BOAC program sponsored by the National FFA. Our project was to redecorate and rewire the city Christmas decorations.



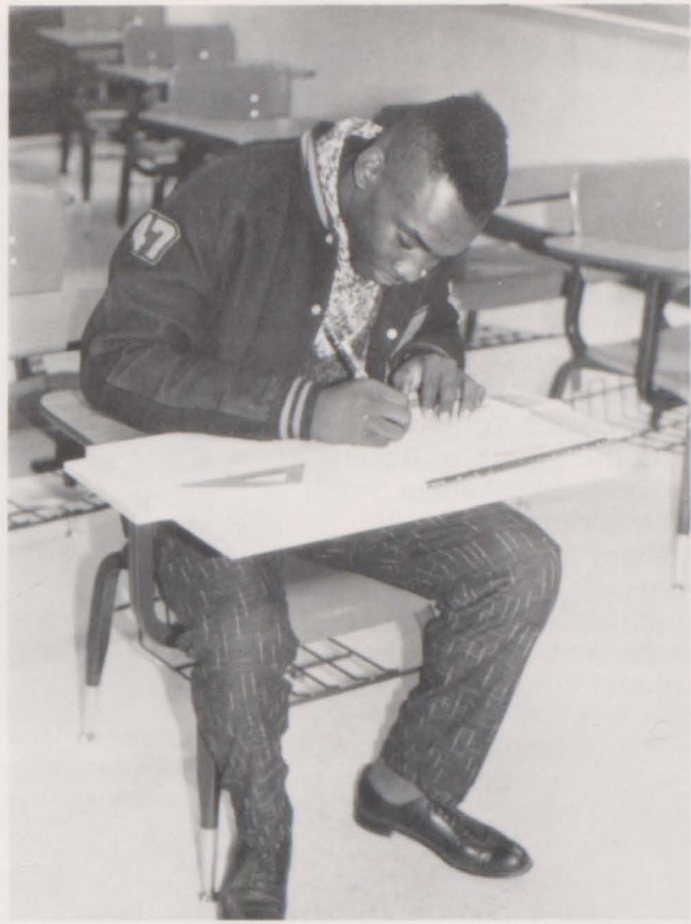
