
These are expressions of how P.H.S. students and staff feel about Mrs. Judy Nunley. Although she has only been here three years, she has become an indispensable part of our school.



- 1 More than 40,000,000 Americans had no health insurance as medical costs soared and became a big issue in the upcoming elections.
- 2. The eruption of Mt. Pinatubo in July caused the U.S. to close Clark A.F. Base in the Philippines, affected weather worldwide and took 330 lives.
- 3. In July Milwaukee police found dismembered bodies in the apartment of Jeffrey Dahmer, killer of 17.
- 4. An attempted coup Aug. 21 in the U.S.S.R. failed, but began the split-up of the nation.
- 5. U.S. public education got more black marks from studies and reform became an issue nationwide.
- Genetic therapy came closer to reality with the National Institutes of Health announcement of trials with cancer and immune disorders.
- 7. U.S. violence increased. Kathy Stoots, sister-in-law of P.H.S. student Waymon Stotts, was shot Oct. 12 in a convenience store near Milan.
- 8. Anita Hill, law professor, accused Supreme Court nominee Clarence Thomas of sexual harassment. Oct. 12 she testified $6^{1/2}$ hours on TV. He was confirmed to replace Justice Thurgood Marshall.
- 9. In Nov. a jury in Palm Beach acquitted William Kennedy Smith of rape charges after much publicity.
- 10. Magic Johnson announced his retirement from pro-basketball Nov. 7 due to contracting HIV virus.
- 11. Dec. 4 Terry Anderson, last of the U.S. hostages, was released
- 12. Many American industries began "downsizing" due to recession, causing workers to worry about their jobs and Pres. Bush's ratings to fall.
- 13. Dec. 14 the Tide played in the state playoffs and Trenton became a "ghost town".




Brad Phillips: I will own a dating servic I will be another Chuck Woolery. I will married, living in California, and have three children.

Shaun Fields: I hope to have graduated from high school and college: I would later like to work in gospel music with my aunt. I would like a wife, two boys, and a girl.




Scott Griffin: I will be living in Washington State working for Boeing or working at an automotive company helping make new types of cars.




Steve Williams: I'm going to be in Hawaii getting a sun tan and watching the natives do the Hula. I'll also be a civil engineer.







Part of Homecoming Week activities was a Powder Puff football game with varsity players as coaches.














Jobs For Tennessee Graduates




















CATCH the SPIRIT
