THIS WAS THE YEAR - - -

*Jay Leno took over the Tonight Show in March after Johnny Carson's 30 year reign, much to David Letterman's chagrin. He moved to C.B.S.

*Sam Walton, richest man in the U.S., died April 5 in Little Rock of cancer.

*The "Dream Team" captured our hearts and the gold medal for basketball in July at the Barcelona Olympics.

*Paul Phelan, a Peabody graduate, beat incumbent Ray Davis in his race for state representative August 6.

*Independent Ross Perot kept us guessing in his off-again, on-again campaign for president during the long summer of political conventions.

*Hurricane Andrew swept through Florida and Louisiana in August destroying homes, businesses and towns. The unprecedented disaster caused insurance companies to fail and building codes to be rewritten.

*Woody Allen was accused of sexual abuse of his adopted daughter, Dylan, which he denied, but admitted an affair with Soon-Yi, 21-year-old adopted daughter of Mia Farrow, his lover of 10 years.

*The British family endured the divorce of Prince Andrew and "Fergie", a devastating fire in Windsor Castle and the separation of Prince Charles and Princess Diana.

*Vice-president Dan Quayle zapped Murphy Brown for being an unwed mother on a TV sit-com.

*The Church of England narrowly voted to allow women to become priests in November.

*Bill Clinton, governor of Arkansas, and Senator Al Gore of Tennessee were elected president and vice-president on November 3. Hillary Clinton was analyzed concerning her role as first lady.

*The Keg and The House of Spirits were robbed December 28 by local men and P.H.S. alumnus Steve Eldridge was shot in the face only days before another local man was found dead from stab wounds on a roadside near Trenton.

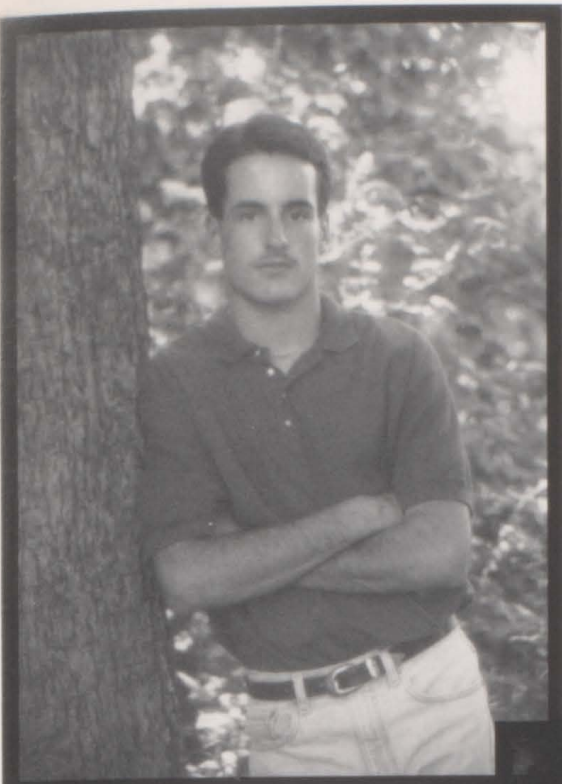
OUTSTANDING SENIORS

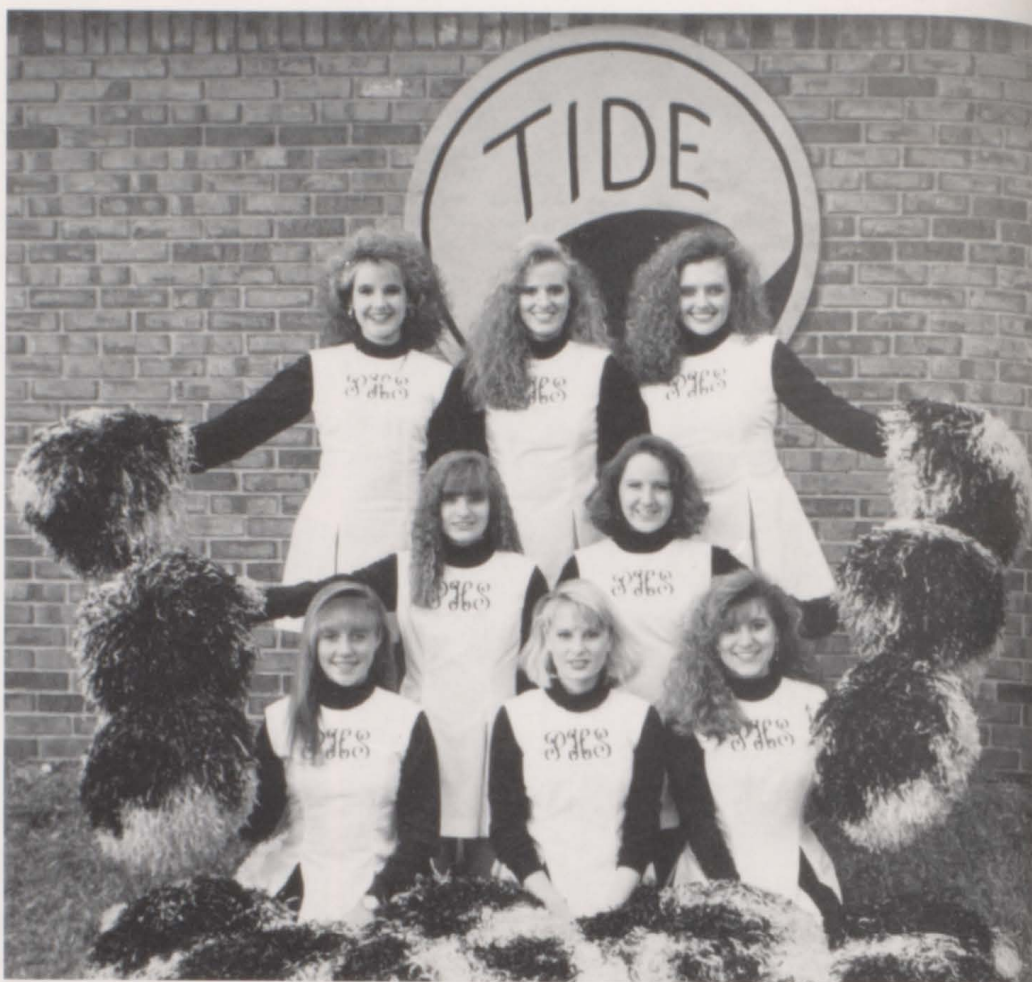


VARSITY CHEERLEADERS

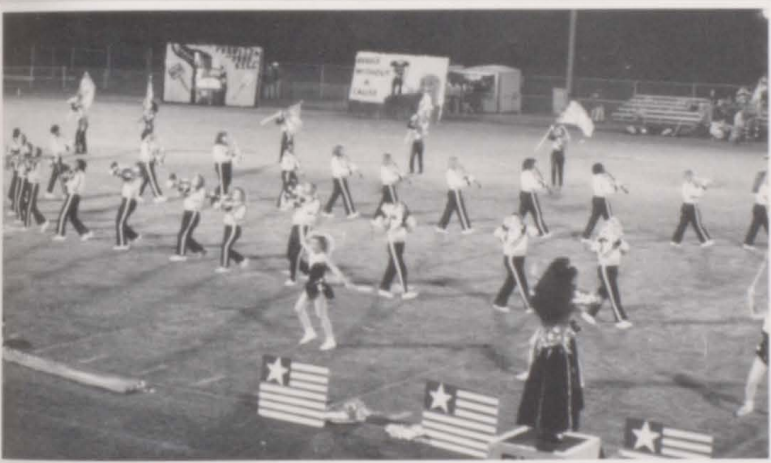

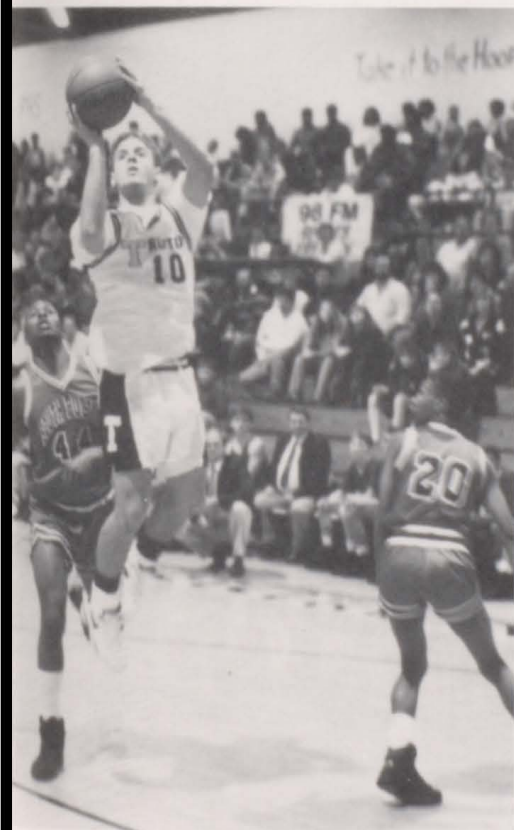

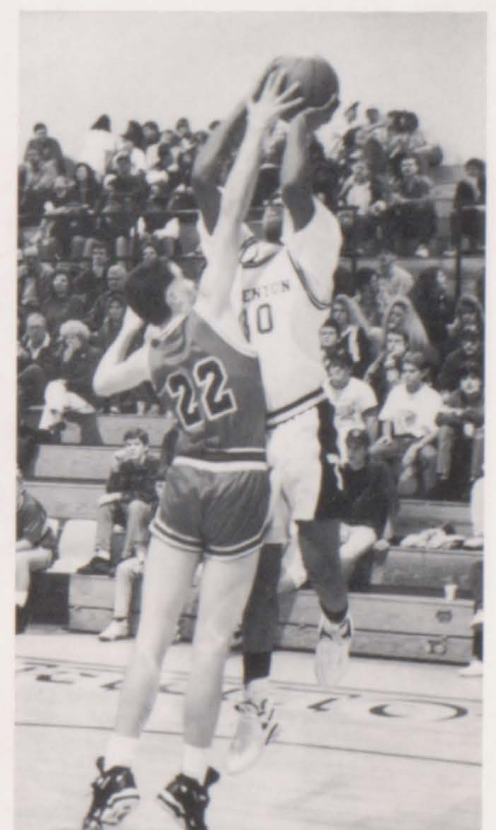

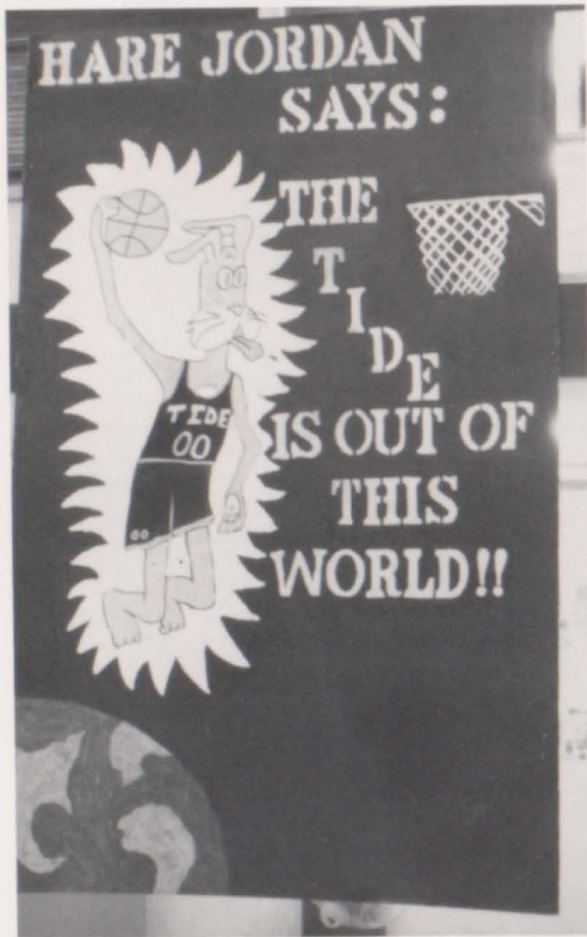

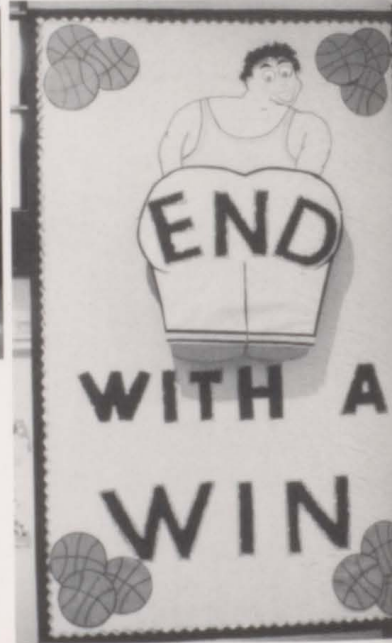

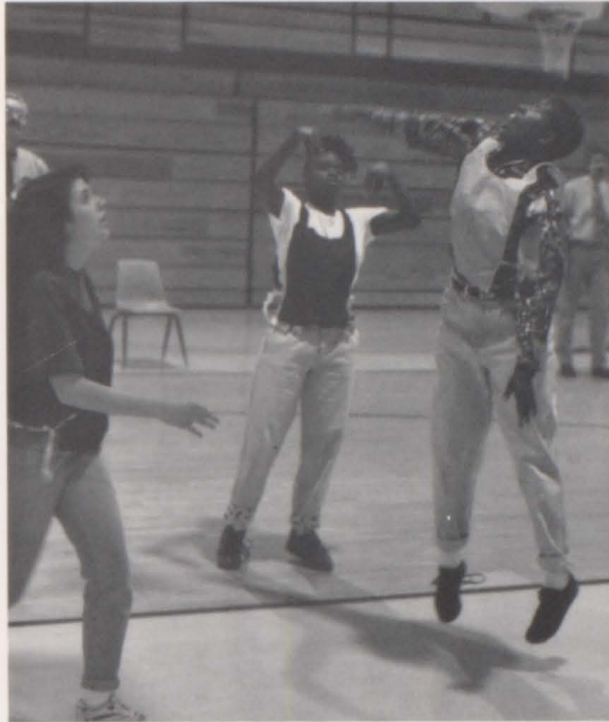

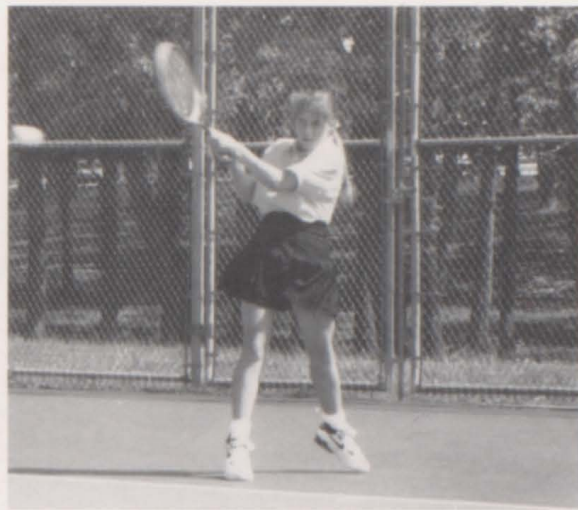

The '93 team, with 10 experienced seniors, looked forward to an improved team record and a trip to the regional tournament.

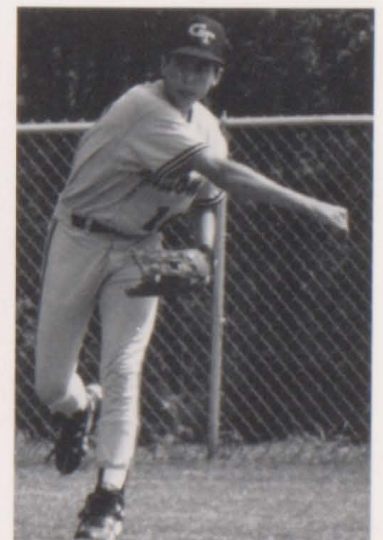

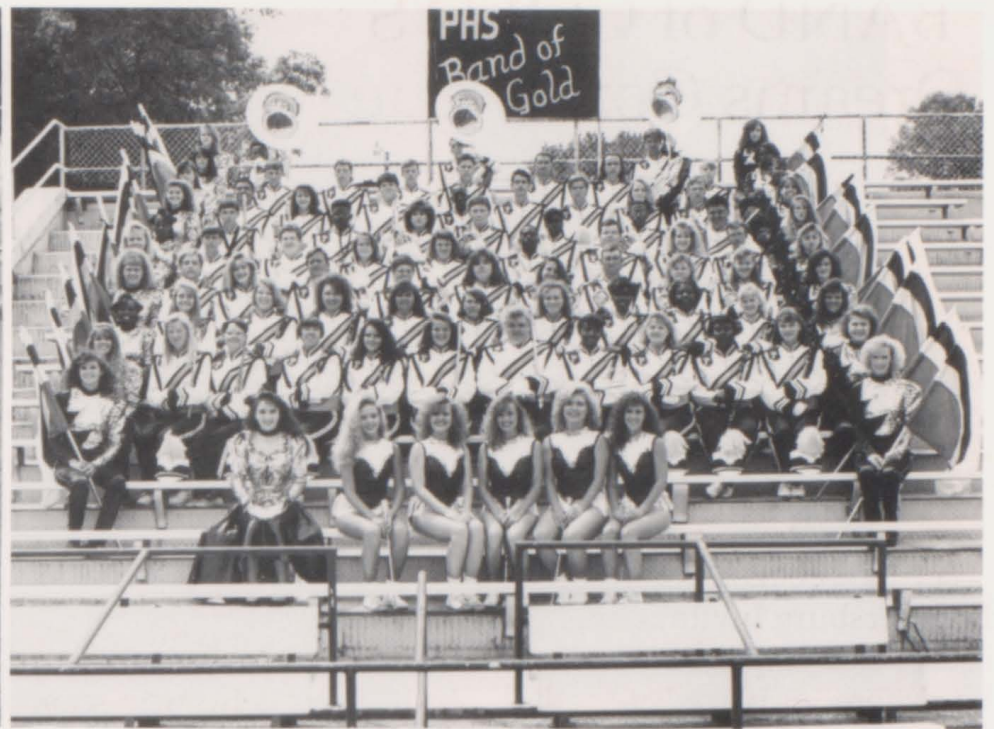
Contest season ended Oct. 31 with the state contest in Franklin. It was a "Happy Halloween" when they received fourth in the state and first place overall in percussion.
