

 A high school in Wedowee, Alabama was burned after the principal threatened to cancel the prom if interracial couples attended.










TENNIS
















ANNUAL STAFF


Facing the "real world" - what a challenge!





After graduation, as days evolve into weeks, months and years, one thing is certain - the Class of '95 will not be forgotten!




