I will not respond to Remind messages and emails between the hours of 4pm and 7:30am. This is my time to be with my family. I will respond to all messages during the hours of 7:30am - 4:00pm. Please email me as the first line of communication; Remind is the second option.

- <u>Student Contract</u>: I <u>MUST</u> have a signed contract and lab safety contract from every student in order to participate in the required laboratory exercises. Signed contracts must be turned in by 8/13/25.
- Materials Needed: The following materials are required by each student!!
 - Large, three-ringed binder (1 ½ inch or 2 inch)
 - Loose-leaf notebook paper
 - Pencils (<u>All</u> tests will be completed in pencil; unless they are online!! Any test completed in ink will have a 10 point deduction from the first, 20 from the second, and so on!)
- <u>Eye Protection:</u> It is state law that eye protection be worn during ALL laboratory experiments. We have safety glasses for you to use. Anyone failing to wear their eye protection will be dismissed from the Laboratory. <u>NO EXCEPTIONS!!</u>
- <u>Classroom Standards:</u>
 - BE PREPARED!! Bring all materials to class. No planners will be signed to go and get materials needed. Failure to bring assignments to class and failure to turn in assignments on time will result in the student receiving a 10% deduction in his/her grade per day that the assignment is late. No late work will be accepted once a zero has been reached.
 - NO Playing Around in the LAB!!
 - NO TALKING when the instructor is talking. If you respect this authority, I will respect you.
 - Raise your hand if you wish to speak.
 - o Stay in your seat until you are dismissed by your instructor.
 - Be polite to everyone. No harsh words or profanity will be tolerated.
 - Food and Drink are allowed in class, but NOT in the Lab. If it becomes a problem, you will lose this privilege. DO NOT PLACE TRASH IN THE TABLES!
 - Cheating will NOT be tolerated. A ZERO will be given.

• Restroom Policy:

- Each student will be allowed three restroom breaks during the semester.
 Once the student has reached their limit of restroom breaks, they will not be allowed to go unless it is a visible emergency. This is in place so that the student gains as much instructional time as possible.
- o If the student has reached their limit of restroom breaks, they can use one from another student but that student loses one of theirs.
- This policy is in place to keep students in class and learning.

• Cell Phone Policy:

- Per a new TN State Law, cell phones, headphones, tablets/ipads, and smartwatches are not allowed during instructional time.
